### Who are you?

That's the theme Do you know who you are? That may not be a question you fully resolve by the time you read and finish this. More than anything else, as you trust in Jesus Christ as your Lord and Savior, you know that you are a Christian. You are also saved. Remember Ephesians 2:8, "It is by grace you have been saved, through faith."

As a new believer, I was taught 2 Corinthians 5:17. I am a new creation in Jesus Christ. The old is gone and the new has come. God has forgiven me in Christ and has taken away my sin. He has freed you and me from the old way of life and given us the new, a restored and redeemed life.

I believe these truths about my new nature, given to me by Christ. However, those things that I believe, don't always filter into how I live. I am forgetful. I am angry. I am impatient. I don't treat others the way I want to be treated. I am too concerned and controlled by the thoughts and opinions of others. I sin. I lack faith. And by those things mentioned, I drift away from the identity given by God and His kingdom, sliding to an identity resembling the ways of the world.

All of us can trap and pigeon hole others through our words and the attitudes that we have. We fail to realize the hurt and damaging effects of what we say. They may be directed toward others, but also right back to ourselves. "You're stupid. You're useless. You're ugly. You'll never amount to anything. You're a failure. You can't do anything right." These words become so destructive that we believe it. We believe the lies said of others and of ourselves to the point of it shaping our identity.

That's now who I am. That's not who you are. I encourage you to read Ephesians 1:1-14. This portion of Paul's letter is powerful, but also dense. It might be confusing. We all need to handle it with prayer and with time. It is very theological and at the same time it is helpful. I believe to see it as a gift given to the children of God. Although I say it gives us incredible insight to who we are, it gives a brighter beacon to the goodness of God, to the praise of His glory alone.

When I mention that this passage is a gift given to us, it reveals a number of gifts bearing light into our true nature, our new identity, letting us know who we truly are. Jesus Christ has made all of it possible. In verse 3, Jesus has blessed us with "every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places." I won't be able to unpack these verses. I simply want to share what the scriptures say about you and me and who we truly are.

Brothers and sisters in Christ, believe this about yourselves; it is good and powerful news. Forgive my grammar, but I am going to place everything in the present tense to make a point about our true identity in Christ. You are a saint. You are chosen. You are holy and blameless. You are predestined. You are adopted. You are sons and daughters of God. You are redeemed. You are forgiven of your trespasses.

You are given great insight as God has made known to you the mysteries of his will. You are given an eternal inheritance. You are sealed with the Holy Spirit. Simply put, you are called and loved by the God of the Universe, your heavenly Father, and we echo, "to the praise of His glorious grace!"

There is everything to be thankful for.


#### **Church Women United**

#### The Doxology

Loike a lot of other churches, we sing the Doxology every Sunday. Did you ever wonder how the song originated? Well, it's an old tune – a very old tune – almost 350 years old.





I sometimes feel old in today's world and maybe I am. French Morgan lived across the street from the parsonage in the big house. One day he told me that he had once talked to a man who fought in the American Civil War.

He said I was talking to a man - who had talked to a soldier - who fought in the Civil War. The Civil War ended 152 years ago, in 1865. When he told me that story I felt kind of old.

When a company makes some improvements to a product, they advertize it as "new and improved." But sometimes an improvement is not better. Remember when Coke Cola changed its product and came out with a new Coke? People didn't like it, so the company went back to its old formula.

We use the Doxology because it's a great tune to glorify God and to thank him for the blessings we have received. There are several "Doxologies" that are used in churches today.

One used by Protestant churches is called the Gloria Patri. The words are "Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Ghost. As it was in the beginning, is now and ever shall be, world without end. Amen, Amen." As well as praising God, the Gloria Patri doxology also recognizes the three Persons of the Holy Trinity.

The Doxology we use is usually referred to as The Common Doxology, and begins "Praise God, from whom all blessings flow". The words were written in 1674 by Thomas Ken, a priest in the Church of England. He intended to use it during morning and evening worship at Winchester College when the dedication of offerings was given. It was sung to the tune "Old 100th".

Some Christian denominations have adopted altered versions of the Doxology to include other words to praise God or as a reference of God's love.

# Three gates of gold

One year our band at East Fairmont High School played a selection titled, Three Gates of Gold. It was a beautiful song that had a poem at the top of each sheet of music about three gates of gold. A few years ago I found the poem in a book I had purchased. The poem was attributed to author Beth Day supposedly from 1835.

#### Three Gates of Gold

If you are tempted to reveal A tale someone to you has told about another, Make it pass before you speak, Three gates of gold.

Three narrow gates: First, "Is it true?" Then, "Is it needful?"

And the next is last and narrowest, "Is it kind?"

And if to reach your lips at last It passes thru these gateways three, Then you may tell the tale, Nor fear what the result of speech may be.

Our band director, Harold Glasgow, told us that most students (and adults) have a natural

curiosity about what's going on among people in their community. When you gossip you betray a confidence and you spread sensitive information or hurtful judgments.

He told us we should think before we speak. He said that before we repeat something we've heard about another person, think: Does this really do any good for me to spread this information? Or am I just trying to be in the know?

Using the words in the poem he said we should ask: Is the information even true? Could I be hurting someone by telling this, even if it's true? Is the information needed? Then he said that if the person you are talking to is not part of the situation there's no need to tell them anything.

There are a number of Bible verses about gossip, especially in Proverbs. In Ephesians 4:29 tells us, "Let no unwholesome word proceed from your mouth, but only such a word as is good for edification according to the need of the moment, so that it will give grace to those who hear."
