

The first celebration of Father's Day is thought to have been in July 1908, in Fairmont, West Virginia. Grace Golden Clayton suggested the special observance to her pastor after a deadly explosion in a nearby town killed 361 men.

In 1923 the third Sunday of June was set as the official day, and in 1924 President Coolidge recommended its national observance. Today it has a fixed place in the calendar of special days in our country.


But devotion to and pride in fathers does not need to wait for official approval. As long as there have been families, love and respect for fathers has existed.

Joshua 4 20 And those twelve stones, which they took out of the Jordan, Joshua set up at Gilgal. 21 And he said to the people of Israel, "When your children ask their fathers in times to come, 'What do these stones mean?' 22 then you shall let your children know, 'Israel passed over this Jordan on dry ground.' 23 For the Lord your God dried up the waters of the Jordan for you until you passed over, as the Lord your God did to the Red Sea, which he dried up for us until we passed over, 24 so that all the peoples of the earth may know that the hand of the Lord is mighty, that you may fear the Lord your God forever."

During the first Saturday in May, I was at a WVBC Board meeting at Parchment Valley. We were discussing matters on making and building disciples in our West Virginia churches. Our leader led us in a very meaningful exercise that touches upon the Joshua passage above. The stones were a commemoration. They were a reminder of God's presence, God's power, and how he delivered them once again through the waters; first the Red Sea and now the river Jordan.

Our leader asked, "What word or phrase would your stone have on it and why?" This was a challenge. I never answer first and thankfully we went clockwise and I was way on the other side of the clock! Hopefully it's a challenge for us today. What word would you use in describing God's hand upon your life? I'll give you some of their answers (I'm glad I took notes!) so that it might stir some ideas for you. I'll share mine and our discussion leader's at the end.

What was on their memory stone? Men and women spoke from the heart and shared LOVE. Another expressed THANKFUL. A couple of people said PERSEVERANCE and DON'T GIVE UP. Someone spoke of GOD'S PROVISION, that God made it possible through the generosity of others to get him/her through seminary. An outdoorsman or scout drew a circle with a dot in the middle which means GONE HOME. This brother in Christ has a home and inheritance in heaven. Someone shared FAITH, another DELIVERANCE, and LOOK AND SEE. A brother or sister mentioned ENCOURAGEMENT. Romans 8:28 was given as a reminder that ALL THINGS WORK TOGETHER FOR GOOD.

I said **RELATIONSHIP**. God, in Christ Jesus, was given and sent to us. He humbled himself. Look at Philippians 2. He made himself a servant. He humbled himself to the point of death and suffered humiliation on a cross. He knows us. He experienced humanity, pain, and loss.

Some of you know my appreciation of 1 Thessalonians 2:8, "We were delighted to share with you not only the gospel of God but our lives as well, because you became so dear to us." Jesus has not only saved us, he loves us to the point of being friends with us.

Our leader's word was **LONGSUFFERING**. She spoke of heartbreaking experiences and loss of loved ones in her life. She mentioned serving God and dealing with her own disappointment with her Heavenly Father. In certain areas, she felt, and as we all might feel that God did not come through. Yet, at the same time, God met her and comforted her through those same difficult places. I am thankful that our convention leader was able to be that transparent and strong enough to share tough things.

I needed to hear this. I hope you did too. I pray the Holy Spirit searches your heart and stirs you to memory of specific instances of God's blessing, provision, and faithfulness. I'd love to hear about your memory stone. Share it with me. Share it with our church. Share it with your loved ones, all the while thanking God and giving Him the glory.
