This simple little symbol, Christ left for you and me, to help us spread his Gospel, through all eternity. —Author unknown



Ukraine relief needed

In response to immediate needs resulting from the Russian invasion of Ukraine that began on February 24, International Ministries has sent an initial grant of \$15,000 in One Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS) emergency relief to the European Baptist Federation to provide humanitarian aid.



The initial relief will provide basic provisions - food, shelter, medicine, and hygiene items - to thousands of people who are fleeing their homes. Displaced people will be served by distribution centers set up by the Ukrainian Baptists to provide temporary shelter and relief.

To donate by mail, make checks payable to the WVBC and write "OGHS-Ukraine Relief" in the memo line. Checks can be mailed to the West Virginia Baptist Convention office at 1019 Juliana St, Parkersburg, WV 26101.

To donate through our church, write "OGHS-Ukraine Relief" in the memo line and ask treasurer Willie Parker to list your donated amount on Line G of the church mission giving remittance form.



Did you know

There were four motivations that brought Baptists into our state.

- First, there was an evangelistic and missionary motivation on the part of individuals. For instance, Rev. John Taylor visited the Tygart Valley about 1773 and found about 100 families near the source of the river (present Pocahontas County), but only one Baptist woman was among them.
- ✓ Second was military service. For example, of the 12 members of the Forks of Cheat church, four were connected with the military as either soldiers or scouts of the nearby fort.
- \checkmark A third motivation for Baptists to enter the region was to organize Baptist associations. The former Redstone Association was formed in 1776.
- \checkmark The fourth reason was the desire for land. About 1783, Baptists from other areas came into our state to acquire free land.

Who broke the walls of Jericho?

A pastor visited a class of boys one Sunday morning to find out what they were learning during Sunday school. "Who broke down the walls of Jericho?" he asked. "Not me, sir," all the boys replied.

"Is a typical answer for this class?" the pastor asked the teacher. The teacher replied, "These are honest boys and I believe them. I don't think they would do a thing like that!"



Frustrated and discouraged, the pastor told the Sunday school Superintendent about his visit to the class and the response from the boys and their teacher. "Pastor, I have known the teacher and the boys for a long time. If they said they didn't do it, that's good enough for me," the Superintendent said.

Next the minister brought the matter before the official board of the church. They discussed it for two hours, and then reported, "Pastor, we see no need to get upset about a little thing like this. Let's just pay for any damages involved and charge it to our general church maintenance account."




