
However, sometimes we get sidetracked. We put the business of the church off and miss the opportunity to minister to others. There are things that will never be done ... unless they are done by each of us.

Father's Day

Ch December 6th 1907, 367 miners working in the Fairmont Coal Company mines in nearby Monongah, West Virginia lost their lives in an explosion leaving an estimated 1,000 children fatherless.

Grace Golden felt that because so many children lost their fathers it would be a good idea to honor all fathers once a year.

She asked her minister to set aside a date, which happened to be July 5 close to her father's birthday. Ever since then it has been observed nationally.


